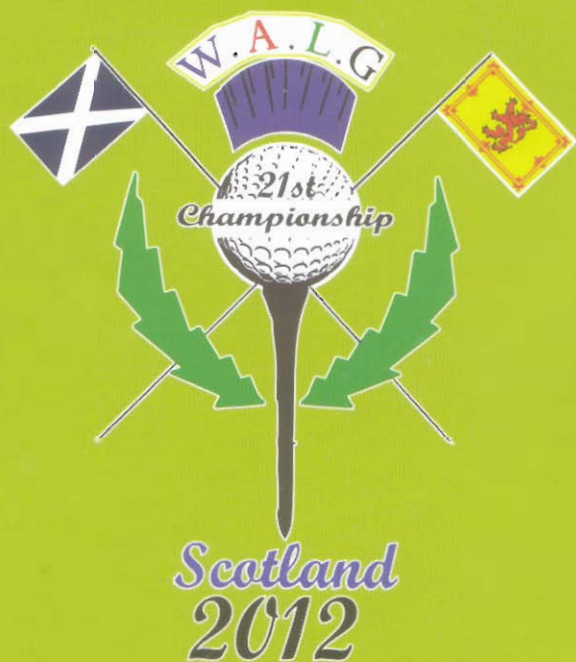

You will be playing the challenging Open qualifying courses of Montrose Medal, Panmure, Monifieth Medal and Scotsraig.

The courses are located in and around the whole of the ancient county of Angus and the city of Dundee. From beautiful Glens, glorious countryside and handsome villages to bustling towns and coastal locations, the non-golfer and those looking for an excellent 19th hole, are well catered for.

Relax and enjoy golf as it should be played on classic links courses.

Montrose Medal (est. 1562)

Yards: 6544 **Holes:** 18 Par: 71

Montrose Medal golf course is the fifth oldest golf course in the world and if you are looking for classic Scottish links courses to play, this is a must.

The Montrose Medal is a traditional links layout requiring good shot-making skills, particularly in the sea breezes which can alter the character of the course on a daily basis.

Montrose Medal golf course holds a singular place in the history of golf in Scotland, and its unique character harks back to the earliest days of golf. If you're planning a golfing holiday in Angus and want to experience an authentic slice of golfing heritage, the Montrose Medal golf course should not be missed.

Monifieth Medal (est. 1643)

Yards: 6655 **Holes:** 18 Par: 71

Monifieth's Medal golf course is a combination of parkland and links, undulating ground flanked on many holes by rows of pine trees. Deep revetted bunkers are another feature.

Two good challenges come at the 4th, a long par four with a prominent mound defending the right of the green, followed by a nerve-rattling par three at the 5th with the intimidating East Coast railway line to the right. The 6th is the course's signature hole with a snaking burn to be carried off the tee usually into the wind.

Generally, Monifieth's Medal Course is an excellent test of your golfing skills, especially during the summer months when its links-like nature comes to the fore. During the Open qualifying rounds much praise was given to the course's condition and overall challenge.



Panmure (est. 1845)

Yards: 6510 **Holes:** 18 Par: 70

Panmure golf course near Carnoustie has hosted many national and regional championships in its time. Perhaps less conspicuous than its neighbours, it is one of the true golfing gems of the Angus coast.

The golf course can be fairly difficult for high-handicappers and novices, and low-handicappers will have to give some thought to their positional play. After a gentle start Panmure tightens noticeably at the 3rd. Ben Hogan practised at Panmure prior to the 1953 Open at Carnoustie and the 6th hole of the course was rated in his top 18 holes.

In general, the greens on the course are small and the bunkers are deep. Accuracy is often more important than length and each hole should be played strategically with thought always given to the approach shot. Whins and thick rough abound throughout the course and can destroy a poorly managed game.

Scotsraig (est. 1817)

Yards: 6310 **Holes:** 18 Par: 71

Scotsraig golf course, the 13th oldest golf club in the world, is used as an Open final qualifying course when the Open is played at St Andrews. Although close to the sea, there is something of a heathland nature to Scotsraig with more trees in evidence than on most links golf courses. Combined with many whin bushes and the rolling nature of the fairways, the course is quite demanding but at the same time makes for very interesting golf. The most memorable hole on the course is the 4th, a par four of average length but with a formidable finish over the heather-covered terrain to a plateau green that is very difficult to hit. A lengthy challenge is the par five, 14th, a test that calls for precise positioning in order to reach the well-defended green.

With its immaculately-tended greens and challenging play, Scotsraig golf course is an impressive links course that seldom gets the attention it deserves. Often overlooked by golfers in favour of the more famous Carnoustie courses, Scotsraig golf course is definitely worthy of consideration for anyone planning a golfing break in Fife.
